Protecting Your Propane Equipment in Severe Events

Use this checklist to ensure propane safety in the event of a wildfire or flood:

0	Turn off the main gas supply valve on your propane tank, if it is safe to do so. To close the valve, turn it to the right (clockwise) until it stops.
0	Ensure that your tank is always clear of debris, weeds and any combustible materials.
0	Turn off propane appliances from the power switch or unplug them, if it is safe to do so.
0	NEVER store or place a propane cylinder indoors or in an enclosed area such as a basement, garage or shed.
0	Have an adequate supply of propane in your tank. During and after a severe event, propane and other types of fuel may not be readily available and roads leading to your home or farm might not be accessible for delivery.

Returning Home After a Wildfire or Flood

If your tank or equipment has been involved in a wildfire or flood, consider the following:

- 1. DO NOT re-enter the area until it is safe.
- 2. If you smell gas, leave the area immediately. DO NOT attempt to inspect the situation yourself.
- 3. DO NOT open any appliance valves, gas valves or propane tank service valves.
- 4. DO NOT attempt to repair, turn on propane supply or activate appliances.
- 5. DO NOT alter your tank or equipment, or disconnect any components.
- 6. DO NOT relocate your propane equipment.
- 7. Call Superior Propane at **1-87SUPERIOR (1-877-873-7467)** to schedule a service call once the area has been deemed safe.

In the Event of an Evacuation

Propane deliveries may be affected in evacuated areas. Regular delivery service will not resume in affected areas until authorities have deemed the areas safe to re-enter.
